

Annual Report 2017-18

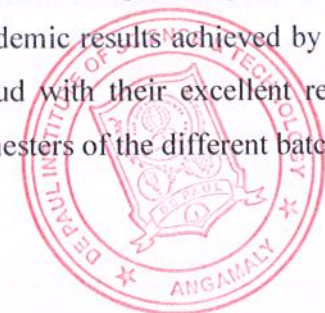
With heartfelt gratitude towards God Almighty and invoking the prayers of St Vincent De Paul, our patron Saint and Holy Founder of Vincentian Congregation Fr Varkey Kattarath, I present the Annual Report of DiST for the Academic Year 2017-18. Started in 2002 with only one programme, now there are 6 Departments, 17 programmes and 1257 students studying in DiST during this academic year.

Changes in the Administrative Team

This year there was a total change in the administrative team of DiST. Principal, Rev. Dr. James Chelapurath V C was elected as the Vice Provincial and Education councilor of Mary Matha Province of Vincentian Congregation. Dr Unny C J, Director of School of Management was appointed the Principal on 1st June, 2017 in his place. Rev Fr. George Pottayil V C, former Manager of DiST twice previously, took charge as the Director of DiST on 1st June 2017. Rev Fr Samir Macwan, Vice Principal took leave to go for higher studies and joined Christ University Bangalore. Finance Director Rev Fr Baiju Poovathumoottil also took leave from the institute to continue his higher studies and joined Christ University Bangalore. Rev Fr Lindo Puthuparambil V C assumed the office of Finance Director of DiST. Rev Fr Gibin Erambil V C left the office of Hostel Director of DiST to take up his new assignment in Mumbai. In his place Rev Fr Thomas Nellanikkattu V C took charge of the Hostel Director. Rev. Dr Norvi Vithayathil, HOD of MSW department and the Director of De Paul Extension Services and De Paul Center for Research & Development joined Christ University to take up a post-doctoral fellowship. Mr Jijo Joy assumed the office of the HOD of the department of Social Work department. Prof Dr Wilson took charge of the School of Management in the seat left vacant by Dr Unny. However, due to health reasons he left the office and Prof Dr Mani K P took charge as the Director of School of Management. Of late, Rev Fr Robin Chittooparambil joined Manipal Deemed University, Manipal for his research programme leading to Ph D.

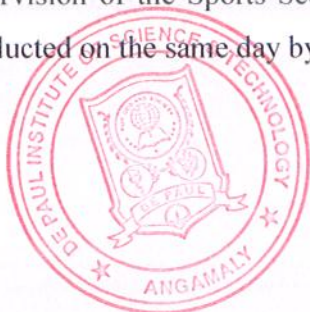
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Sports Day

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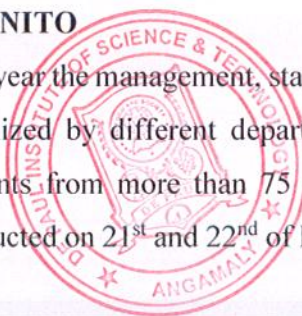
All Kerala Inter Collegiate Volley Ball Tournament

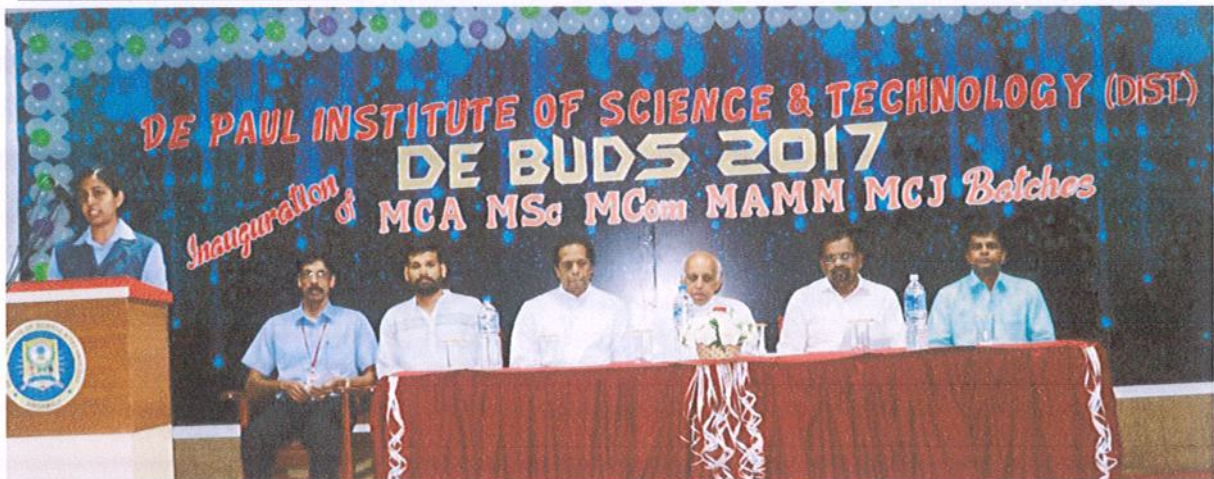
Departmental Activities

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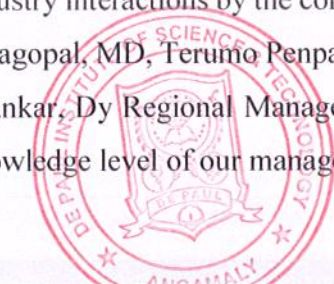


Placement Training

An add-on-course on Android for BCA15 batch was conducted for BCA students by Mr. Bibin Benny, one of our alumni of the BCA 13 batch. Another add on course on Fundamentals of Hardware assembling and Installation was given to the BCA 17 batch students.

Placements

The college makes every effort to place our students in high profile organizations. In DiST we try to make the students employable and for this we give aptitude test training and soft skill training in all the departments on a continuing basis. Each department has a staff in charge of placements of the students.


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In the School of Management, 54 students of MBA 15 and MHRM 15 students received a total number of 68 offers. In the Commerce Department, 24 students of B Com and 9 students of M Com got good placements. Computer Science Department also could secure many placements for their students, namely, 23 students from MCA, 2 from M.Sc., and 19 from BCA. In the School of Media studies 19 students from B.A. ECJ, 6 from B.A. Multi Media and 2 from B A Animation were placed in the campus recruitments.

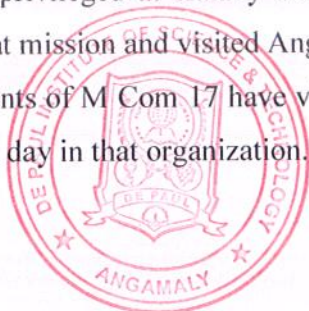
Outreach Activities and Participation in Swachh Bharath

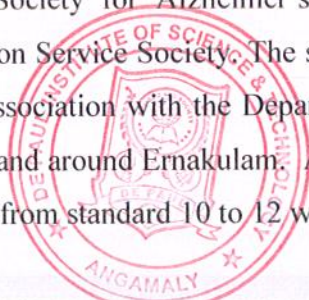
Association Activities

The speakers' club furnishes the pupils with extra opportunities to use English language. The idea of each one teaches one is being used in this club. It hosts different activities to promote English language under the leadership of club members.

Apart from the classroom activities De-Paul finishing school masterminds a weekly program of screening quotes of great personalities and words for the week to inspire and spur students. A video presentation of a couple of musings and relevant new words is displayed in the visual aids of the institution

Counselling

DiST provides professional counselling and psychological assistance for students and staff. This is to promote and ensure a healthy environment and emotional wellbeing of all. The college has two professional counsellors providing counseling to U.G. and P.G. students. An introductory session is given to each class, so that the misconception about the word 'counselling' is removed. The counselling takes place in a private confidential environment. Different therapies and methods are used by the counsellor to help the individual depending upon the nature and need of the issue.

On an average of 50-60 students are counseled every month and will come for follow up sessions if needed. Group sessions like motivational classes are given once in a semester or a year.

DiST Library

The mission of DiST library is to support the college mission in identifying, organizing, preserving and offering accessible resources which serve the needs of college members, students and the community at large. In addition, the library seeks to locate, acquire, organize and select the most appropriate material and make it accessible to users.



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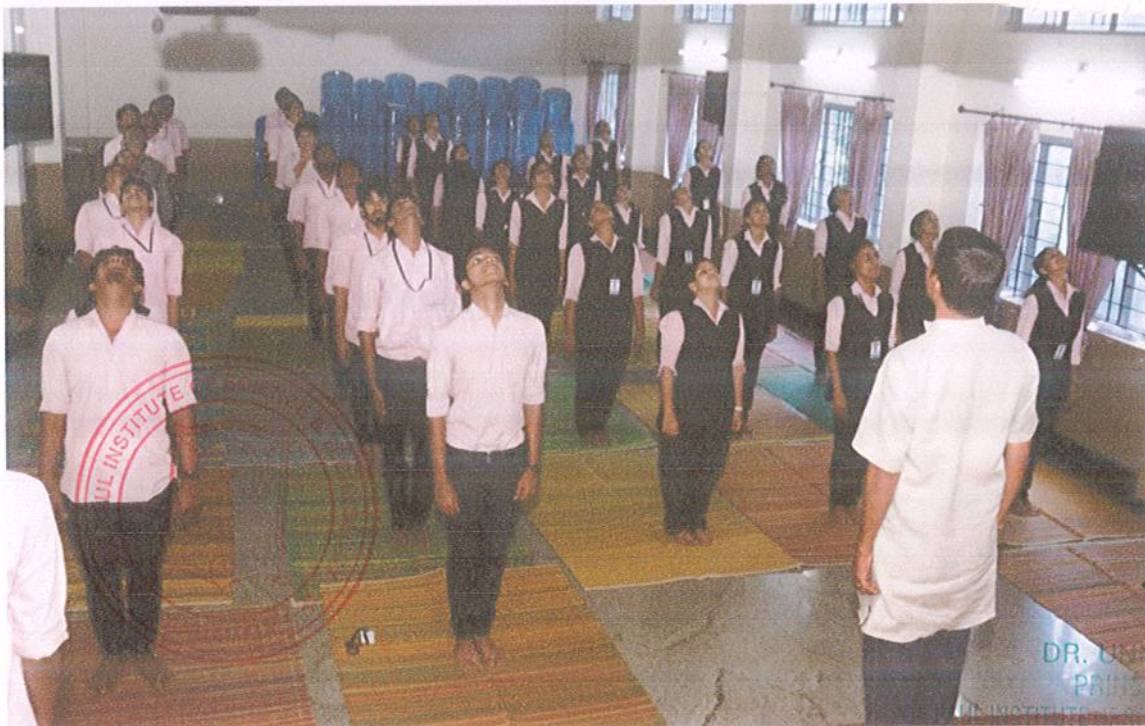
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Library had a wonderful year with many activities in its calendar. The Library host a collection of 17000 books, 90 journals and periodicals, 42 newspapers, 1000 plus CDs and DVDs, 4000 plus e-journals, Project reports, Theses and dissertations and 2 on-line databases. Around 1200 students and 140 staff members made use of the Library during 2017-2018. Reading Day was celebrated on 19/06/2017 with great enthusiasm. An essay writing competition was held for the whole college. 26 students participated representing the available batches and first three participants from PG and UG were given prizes.
